Retail financial services — Merchant category codes

1 Scope

This document defines code values used to enable the classification of merchants into specific categories based on the type of business, trade or services supplied. Values are specified only for those merchant categories that are generally expected to originate retail financial transactions.

It is not within the scope of this document to mandate the use of merchant category codes in any given situation.

4 Merchant category codes

Merchant category codes shall be allocated to enable the classification of merchants into specific categories based on the type of business, trade or services supplied.

New businesses, trades or services shall be allocated a code value that is reasonable and substantially different from other code values and that is separate and distinct from other industries.

Code assignments are maintained by the ISO 18245 maintenance agency. The scope and specific responsibilities of the ISO 18245 maintenance agency are specified in the *MA Guidelines for ISO 18245*.^[1]

5 Application procedure for code value additions, changes and deletions

An applicant shall apply to the ISO 18245 maintenance agency to request approval of a merchant category code addition, change or deletion by completing the merchant category code application specified by the ISO 18245 maintenance agency.
